### **Previous**

 Callaghan Innovation – post-harvest supply chain temperature project created best practice guidelines for container loading

 NZ Avocado – AvoVantage, looked to reduce % of unsound fruit & develop best practice guides on disease management; launched Avo Diary tech (2020)

& temperature monitoring (2019)

PGF initiative – to fund horticulture & viticulture career coordinators, including a pilot in Northland to match potential workers with potential employees (2019)

Northland Regional Council – application accepted to take water from Te Aupōuri aquifer to support \$145m+ of potential horticultural development (Sept 2021)

- NZ Avocado natural resource management; providing input into pan-sector and government discussions as new resource management policy is being developed; High Health Scheme (through GIA partnership for biosecurity) & PlantPass certification; training for Avo Diary tech to monitor spray and pest work
- Olivado building an expanded avocado oil production plant at Ngawha

### Challenges

- Shipping e.g., inspection delays, shipping overseas via Tauranga
- Size small average fruit size
- Costs new environmental reforms & FEPs increase compliance costs
- Export e.g., congested Australian market, increased competition from South America across Asian markets
- Supply/demand due to increased planting
- Water availability recent application accepted, despite controversy
- Pollination services increased demand
- Labour demand for highly skilled labour & high unemployment rate in Northland

- Opportunities
- Centre of excellence in Northland for avocados
- 'Growing Avocados' Northland water storage & use project
- Infrastructure Olivado's avocado oil production plant will service Northland's avocado boom
- **R&D** into high-value fruit production, new products e.g. avocado powder, working with other sectors to develop sustainable systems, grower-led regional network
- Long term success relies on differentiated story of sustainability, environment and nutrition
- Overcome set up costs e.g. via joint ventures, contracting out, leasing & selling
- New markets small exporters pioneering growth



Address water access challenges – by all sectors coming together to identify a long-term, sustainable approach; use the data to identify an efficient, equitable way to share the available water (social licence)

Develop circular economies – can Olivado teach other industries how to implement sustainable, closed-loop systems that turn waste products into fertiliser etc.?



Share shipping with other sectors – collaborate with other sectors to try and find a way to aggregate seasonal exports so that shipping and other logistics could be shared



- Develop a branding proposition could avocado work with bigger sectors to develop a branding proposition?
- Meet increased demand for pollinators by working with the apiculture and horticulture sectors to identify solutions, e.g., use bumblebees or other insects
- Support growth in the Kaipara could the sector work with Kaipara Kai to investigate opportunities for avocado (including new varieties) in the Kaipara?
